We have also included social opportunities—a Christmas informal time, a night at Indiana Downs, and the annual GIPHCC golf outing.

The golf outing was a huge success due to the concerted efforts of Vicki Garrett, the Board, and the rank and file membership. Everyone got behind the event because they all know that the profits are used to support GIPHCC programs. The day was a classic example of over 100 people joining together for a day of fun and friendship.

The same can be said for our November Vendors Expo. This November's Expo will be the 3rd such event. It is an excellent opportunity to honor our very loyal associate members and to give them an opportunity to show off their newest products in a relaxed and informal local setting. At the same time we have continued to take part in the annual coat drive for Wheeler Mission as our ongoing community service project.

Perhaps 2 of our biggest accomplishments have been the SkyTrak advertising and the creation of our web site, www.giphcc.com. SkyTrak has gained national recognition in National PHCC and the web site's use is growing steadily.

We have also sponsored training sessions: this year it was a 6 week seminar by Nancy Lorenzano on sales techniques. It was so successful that it will be offered again later in the year.

All of these things are possible through the continuing vision of our membership and leadership. We have built on a strong tradition of leadership (a fact we sometimes forget or take for granted). Our chapter has supplied numerous presidents of IAPHCC throughout its history. Many members are leaders in the industry: Bill Ciriello, Chairman of the State Plumbing Board; Steve Pfendler; Brad Isley; Paul Hallam, Plumbing Instructor of the Year; and Eugene Schuler and Laura Ciriello Benedict, who will be installed as IAPHCC's incoming president and president-elect respectively. But we can't sit back and rest on our laurels.

In the past year our membership numbers have dropped; this is understandable; people are looking at the immediate future and tightening their economic belts. However, we know that GIPHCC is working and that there are immeasurable benefits; we need to sell this message to non-member contractors and

associates alike. One way for our membership to participate is to **bring a non-member to future meetings.**
