When 2009 closed, the GIPHCC web site had 81 viewers in the month of December, now the statistics for the month of November 2010 are up to 114 people, who visited the site 136 times. Growth in use of the site and knowledge of its existence has been slow but steady.

Some of you may never use the site, but your information is on the site for others to see. And others do use the site. We have had attendees at meetings to whom we do not send the Ventstack; the only way they could have learned about the meeting is through the web site. Others (customers, not industry members) have gone to the site through WTHR. From there, they are finding individual plumbers to contact and ask their questions of and do business with.

The site has several components: the front page features a Featured Contractor. There is a section with pictures of our activities—the new Associates Award, Eugene as IAPHCC President, our advertising award, the Chapter Excellence Award, our participation in the annual Wheeler Mission coat drive, and our annual golf outing. The Ventstack is available to read, along with back issues. Lists of current contractor and associate members appear, along with the WTHR participants. Water Well Pump Installer Licensing Requirements

With the passage of Senate Enrolled Act 356 (SEA 356) by the 2010 Indiana General Assembly, "a person who installs or repairs water well pumps" must be licensed by the IDNR beginning in 2011. In addition, SEA 356 requires that a "licensed water well driller or pump installer must complete at least six (6) hours of approved continuing education before December 31 of each even-numbered year for license renewal." SEA 356 became effective July I, 2010.

The IDNR, Division of Water anticipates that a single license card will be issued that will specify whether an individual is a water well driller, water well pump installer, or both. The annual fee for an original or renewed license (driller, pump installer, or both) is expected to remain at \$100.

Forms are available to apply for the water well pump installer license for individuals currently installing water well pumps (these provisions expire July 1, 2011.) You must provide a Reference Statement with the application.

FLAG: Find the License Attorney General

PHCC has initiated the FLAG program (Find the License Attorney General). The program is simple, find an advertisement without a license number or take a picture of a vehicle advertising plumbing without a license number and email or snail mail to the Indiana PHCC office. Brenda will then distribute the infraction across the state. Next, print off on your letterhead the form letter to the Attorney General and a copy of the infraction, along with the official Consumer Complaint form and drop it in the mail. The Attorney General will receive complaint letters from all over the state at one time.


But first be sure that your own ads and trucks comply with the law. Know the law.
